This innovation organization teaches businesses how to tap into courageous thinking, compassionate leadership, and curiosity to bring their best work to life. Worline is also a research scientist at Stanford University's Center for Compassion and Altruism Research and Education; Executive Director of CompassionLab, the world's leading research "collaboratory" focused on compassion in the workplace; and co-author of *Awakening Compassion at Work: The Quiet Power that Elevates People and Organizations*.
